He has served in various criminal justice sections of the Attorney General's Office. He also spent time in private practice counseling corporate clients on a variety of issues. He is a regular speaker on issues involving firearms and Ohio's concealed carry law. He teaches a variety of subjects at the Ohio Peace Officer's Training Academy and is a civilian firearm instructor. He was a founding officer of the National Association of Firearm Instructors.
